# Information Rules of Conduct for Competition

- NFHS & NYSPHSAA Rules will be followed unless noted otherwise.
  - 6 individual practices before first competition
  - 16 meet maximum
  - 2 nights rest between competitions
  - Maximum distance 3.1 miles or 5000 meters
  - Maximum of 2 meets per week (Monday- Sunday)

## **Advanced Placement - Move Up Date:**

In order for a modified runner to participate in the sectional meet, they must have met the requirements of NY state advanced placement protocol. The athlete also has to move to varsity prior to having completed 50% of their competition season. The athlete must also **finish 6 competitions** before they can compete in the sectional meet. Modified meets count towards the 6 meets.

#### Out of state competition

Host schools with teams coming from out of state, must verify that they are sanctioned by their state.

## Sectionals 2024

Site: Mt. Markham High school Saturday Nov. 9th, 2024

### **Entering:**

Register at ny.milesplit.com. Each team can enter **up to** 10 runners. Failure to enter on time will eliminate your team from sectionals. Please do not enter your entire roster.

#### Eligibility: Team/ Individual Entries for Sectionals:

Each team may enter up to and no more than 10 runners in the sectional meet. Individuals must have completed (finished) 6 varsity contests prior to the sectional race in order to be eligible for the meet.

Multi school meets, including double dual meets, count as 1 meet. If an athlete is injured and is not able to compete in 6 meets, they must receive a waiver from the Section III Office in order to compete at sectionals.

#### Awards: See time schedule

- 1) Awards to the winning team and individual race winner.
- 2) Awards will be given to each winning team if the class is split into divisions.

#### Parking:

Parking is free this year.

#### **Ticketing (Admission Charge):**

Ticketing will be done through Hometown Ticketing. It is a digital ticket system. Check the section 3 website for more information.

\*\* No cash tickets will be available. Tickets will be taken at the gate as you enter the Mt. Markham stadium area.

#### **State Meet Advancement:**

The top team in each class (boys and girls), along with the top 5 individuals (boys and girls) from each class will advance to the state meet.

**Sectional Race Times:** 40 mins between girls races and 30 between boys races. This schedule will allow for some of the cars to clear out for parking and also will let schools leave earlier and show up later. **Daylight savings time will have started and it will be dark by 4:40PM.**

1) Send a letter of intent to host the sectional meet, to Michelle Rauber, by Dec. 14th 2024. Download the Request to Host A Sectional Event from the Section 3 website. It is under the forms section. Fill out the form completely along with the budget page. Send this form to Michelle Rauber no later than **Dec. 14th**, **2024**. You also need to include a parking plan for the event, which will accommodate 1000 cars.

Important change- If your site receives the bid for the sectional meet you can not change the course that was bid (in any way), unless you contact the section III coordinators for approval!! The course that won the bid will be the course that is run at sectionals!!

# **Federation Meet/ NXR Qualifier**

**Date: Saturday November 23rd** 

Site: Bowdoin State Park, Wappingers Falls NY

#### Federation meet information

- 1) The only way to qualify for NIKE National meet is going to the Federation Meet.
- Nike will use this meet to take the top 2 teams automatically and top 5 individuals.
- 3) Teams & individuals will still go through their schools for payment and they will race in school issued uniforms. It will not be any different looking then the normal Federation Meet.
- 4) Nike will host the boys and girls Federation Races, along with Open Races and the Northeast Championships.
- 5) Your resume is imperative to get teams into the federation meet. It is going to be extremely hard to get in without teams going outside the section or competing against teams who have a really good resume and get close or beat them. Just can't say we beat this team or we were close, time gaps, team comparison, ets.
- 6) If you think you have a shot at making nationals start thinking about it now and keep an ongoing list throughout the season.
- 7) If individuals that do not make the state meet but want a chance at 1 of our 2 at large bids, they need to let the coordinators know before the state meet starts. This will allow the coordinators to make a list of potential people who are not in the state meet.
- \*\* Any team or individual that does not make it to the Federation Meet has the opportunity to still run in the Nike Open Races. Entries will be made to Nike.

## **Modified Cross Country Information**

- 1) 6 individual practices before an athlete can compete in a meet
- Team & individual maximum number of contest 10
- 3) Minimum number of nights before next contest is 2
- 4) Number of competitions per day is 1

#### Rules

1) Maximum distance is 1.5 miles for the first half of the season, then up to 2 miles.

- 2) Multi school contests/ tournaments/ championships Championships are prohibited, No Individual or sectional championship is allowed, ribbons may be awarded to top individuals in races.
- 3) It is recommended that there be a minimum of 6 meets scheduled for Modified Cross country
- 4) If a modified runner moves to varsity they can not move back down to the modified level.

**Directions:** 

**From Eastern Mohawk Valley** – from Mohawk, take Rt. 28 north to Richfield Springs, take right onto Rt. 20 west 10 miles to West Winfield, at Mount Markham Middle School take right onto Fairground Rd., the High School driveway will be 400m on left.

**From North** (Utica/Rome) – from New Hartford, take Rt. 8 south to Bridgewater, take left onto Rt. 20 east 3 miles to West Winfield, at Mount Markham Middle School take left onto Fairground Rd., the High School driveway will be 400m on the left.

**From West** (Syracuse Area) – take Rt. 20 to West Winfield, at Mount Markham Middle School take left onto Fairground Rd., the High School driveway will be 400m on the left.

-Or-

Take Rt. 5 to New Hartford, take Rt. 8 south to Bridgewater, take left onto Rt. 20 east 3 miles to West Winfield, at Mount Markham Middle School take left onto Fairground Rd., the High School driveway will be 400m on the left.

**Team Drop Off/Bus Parking:** Buses will enter the front entrance driveway of the high school and drop teams at the circle in front of the school (teams will walk around the gymnasium to the entrance to the athletics fields) and buses will then proceed out of the exit driveway and will be directed to Precisionmatics' parking lot, a manufacturing facility less the one mile away on Rt. 20 with the Red Door Diner next door. When teams are ready they will call for the bus and be picked up at the drop off.

**Team Tent Areas**: Team tents can be set up in the grass area immediately behind the school. Please make sure tents are securely staked down.

**Spectator Parking**: Parking in the high school parking lots and the elementary and middle school parking lots directly across the street. There will be staff help direct the buses and spectator parking.

**Spectators**: All spectators and teams will enter via the gates on the left side of the building beyond the gymnasium and fitness center entrance to the high school. See school district parking lot map.

**Officials:** The PE coaches' offices in the girl's and boy's locker room will be used as the officials' locker room.

**Inclement weather plan**: In the case of severe weather and athletes need to seek shelter, the locker rooms and the gymnasium will be available.

**Bathrooms/Port-a-potties:** The bathrooms in the locker rooms, the bathrooms underneath the awning at the back of the school and port-a-potties behind the stadium and near the starting line will be available.

**Course:** The course will be roped off with ½" yellow rope and marked with ground marking paint.

**Awards Area**: If weather allows awards will be on track in front of stadium bleachers, otherwise awards will be presented in the gymnasium.

**Athletic Trainer/Medical:** An athletic trainer and WWFD Ambulance will be on site. Additional Event Details

**Concessions:** A concession stand with a variety of food and drink will be run by the Mount Markham HS FCCLA Club and their Advisors.

**Press Box:** The High School Speech and Debate Club and Advisor will be responsible for announcements and music in the press box.

**Finish Line Help**: The Jr. Class and Honor Society and their Advisors will be responsible for filling and handing out water at the finish line

**Grounds and Parking:** The High School FFA Club and their Advisor will help prepare the grounds and be responsible for helping with parking day of the event.
